YODELING COWBOY COMIC SOURDOUGH SLIM HIGHLIGHTS FARM BUREAU SUPPER SHOW IN PASO ROBLES

The San Luis Obispo County Farm Bureau will host its first ever Farm Bureau Supper Show on Saturday, April 14, 2007 in conjunction with the Cattlemen's Western Art Show and Sale, hosted at the Paso Robles Events Center in Paso Robles. This year's featured entertainment will include special guest, yodeling cowboy comic and songster Sourdough Slim, plus local cowboy, singer and song writer, Dave Stamey.

For his skills as a yodeler, Sourdough Slim was honored by the Academy of Western Artists with the 2001 Will Rogers award for "yodeler of the year." His stage show combines western music, yodeling and accompaniment on accordion, guitar, ukulele and harmonica, with a trunk full of comical gags, rope tricks and characterizations. The Supper Show will also feature the song stylings of local cowboy balladeer Dave Stamey. Voted Male Performer of the Year by the Western Music Association and a recipient of the Will Rogers Award by the Academy of Western Artists, Stamey has entertained audiences at countless shows and events in several states.

Admission for the Supper Show is \$40 per person, including a southwestern supper with wines from various San Luis Obispo wineries along with live entertainment. Entrance to the Supper Show is through the Cattlemen's Art Show & Sale doors in the Pavilion. Enjoy the western art show, then continue into the Special Events Center for the Supper Show starting at 5 p.m. and live stage performances at 7 p.m. Parking at the fairgrounds is free. They will present 400 never-before-exhibited paintings and sculptures that will stir the imaginations of the thousands of people expected to attend. The event kicks off on Friday, April 13, with an artist's wine and hors d'oeuvre reception. A preview and sale runs from 5-9 p.m. Show hours are 11 a.m.-6:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 14, and 10 a.m.-3:30 p.m. on Sunday, April 15.
